Events that require Support

Youth Races at Victoria Park.

March / April. We need at least 15 volunteers each Saturday morning to successfully promote these events. (4 separate events)

Evening Time Trials.

April / August. To run these events we require 10 volunteers each Thursday evening throughout the season. 2 of these volunteers must be "Trained Timekeepers". Anyone interested in timing the events will receive the appropriate training. (Note it is not a requirement for a member to volunteer for every week, just help out in 2 or 3 events throughout the season)

Open Time Trial

August. 12 Volunteers are required for this event.

New Members club rides.

Year round. 2 Experienced members are required to supervise each of the new members rides.

In order to improve the clubs performance in carrying out its commitments a register is to be introduced so that members can indicate well in advance how they can help.
