2011 has seen a number of offences, where cycles have been stolen. If you were unfortunate enough to have this happen to you, Would you be able to help the Police to trace your property by providing the identification details of your bike, such as the make, model, and most importantly the frame number?

We are asking for your support. To help the Police identify lost and stolen property by registering your Cycle at www.immobilise.com

This is the National Mobile Property Register (NMPR) that the Police have access to 24/7 and is used to trace the owners of lost and stolen property.

This Free service is available to all members of the public to register their property

How to register for Free ? Simply note down the Make, Model and Frame Numbers on your bike/s, or serial numbers from any property such as mobile phones and Laptops. Then follow the link from the Merseyside Police website to www.immobilise.com

When registering please click on the section 'How did you hear about Immobilise?' And select **Merseyside Police, Sefton Area, Op Dragonfly.**

Why bother ?

Police forces nationally have 24/7 access to the database The more Cycles and electrical goods that are registered, the less attractive they are to a thief, and identified property greatly assists the Police to return it to the owner.

The good News is "It Works"

Three people have recently been charged in the Southport area following recovery of stolen property registered on the database.

Further Steps you can take to secure your bike ?

Consider fitting an **Immobitag.**

This is an electronic chip that has its own unique reference number. The chip is fitted into the frame of your bike and is read by the Police using a hand held scanner. This cycle security chip is being offered at a special Police and Homewatch scheme Price of £7.00 (Normal Retail Price is £15.00)
